

# TWO-YEAR B.Ed. DEGREE PROGRAMME (SEMESTER PATTERN UNDER CBCS)

# FULL-TIME AND REGULAR PRE-SERVICE TEACHER EDUCATION

(With effect from the Academic Year 2021 - 2022)

### 1. Eligibility for Admission to B.Ed. Programme:

A candidate shall be eligible for admission to B.Ed. programme (in Government /Government Aided/Self-Financing Colleges of Education) leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) provided fulfilling the prescribed education qualification and other requirements as specified in the B.Ed. Admission Guidelines of the Government of Tamil Nadu in force from time to time.

### 2. Duration of the Programme:

The B.Ed. programme shall be for duration of two academic years consisting of four semesters. Each semester is spread over for a period of 100 working days (36 hours in a week spreading over for 5 or 6 working days in a week, excluding the period of examination and admission.

### 3. Curriculum of Programme:

The curriculum of the B.Ed. programme consists of fourteen Compulsory Theory Courses, one Elective Course out of six elective courses and Engagement with the Field (School Internship, Courses on Enhancing Professional Capacities (EPC), and an Online Course).

Level – I is pertaining to standard VI to VIII and is compulsory for all the student-teachers to get many-fold experiences in classroom teaching of their pedagogic subject during the School Internship. The students of Economics, Commerce, Psychology, Philosophy, Sociology, Political Science, Logic, and Indian Culture should study and teach the subject Social Sciences, students of Computer Science should study and teach the subject Mathematics; and students of Home Science should study and teach the subject Science prescribed in the school curriculum at Level -I.

Level –II is pertaining to standard IX and X for undergraduate qualified student-teachers and standard XI and XII for post graduate qualified student-teachers. The student-teachers need to get an overview of their pedagogy subject prescribed in the school curriculum and also to teach their concerned pedagogic subject at Level –II during the School Internship.

Note 2: The Enhancing Professional Capacities (EPC) records are to be prepared and submitted at the time of practical examination. The EPC records are to be prepared based on the theoretical inputs and practical experiences gained from reading and reflecting on text, performance in drama and art related to teaching and learning process, critical understanding and usage of ICT for effective teaching and learning process, and understanding of the strengths and weaknesses of one's own self.

#### 4. Medium of Instruction:

The candidates admitted into the B.Ed. degree programme in the Colleges of Education affiliated to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University should select the medium of instruction either as English or Tamil (as per the availability of medium of instruction in the Colleges of Education). After the last date of admission, Principals of the Colleges of Education should submit the name list to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University along with the medium of instruction chosen by each candidate. In case, if the admitted candidates prefer to change their medium of instruction at later stage

of the programme, it should be permitted only after obtaining necessary written permission from the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, prior to the publication of Nominal Roll.

Medium of instruction chosen by the candidate to pursue the B.Ed. degree programme will be indicated in the B.Ed. degree programme Transfer Certificate alone. Classroom instruction shall be carried out separately for different medium of instruction in Colleges of Education.

### 5. Attendance

- 1. Each candidate, whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, should gain 85% of attendance in each semester, failing which he/she will not be permitted to appear for examination. However, as per the decision of the Syndicate of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University in its meeting held on 20.08.2020 candidates who are able to gain attendance only up to 75% on medical ground, shall be permitted to appear for the examination after getting condonation of attendance, adhering to the norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University.
- 2. Student who is continuously absent for ten days or more at any point of time, a showcase notice shall be served stating that he/she has to forfeit his/her admission, if, he/she fails to report to the college immediately.
- 3. The student, whose attendance is below 70% and more than 40% may be given readmission within a period of two consecutive years with full fee and in such a case the student has to fulfill all the rules and regulations which are followed by a fresh student.
- 4. The student, who does not have adequate attendance, shall not be considered for award of any scholarship or any kind of financial aid by the University/Government/Quasi Government Agencies/NGOs.

### 6. Examinations

Each candidate, whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University only permitted for written and practical examinations. Candidates who have failed to satisfy the minimum attendance norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University in each semester will not be permitted to appear for the written examination and or practical examinations.

The term-end external examination for all semesters shall be conducted by the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University at the end of each semester. The written examination for each theory course shall be conducted for 70 marks.

### Internal Assessment:

The award of continuous comprehensive evaluation (i.e. internal assessment) marks in each semester for theory courses shall be distributed as follows:

In case a candidate secures less than 50% of marks prescribed for the internal assessment, then one more opportunity shall be given to him/her to improve the internal marks in the specific course during the next semester.

### Appearance for the Examinations:

Each candidate whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University shall apply for the written/practical examinations. Candidates, who have failed to satisfy the minimum attendance norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, will not be permitted to appear for the written/practical examinations. However, the basis of permitting a student to appear for the examination shall be in accordance with the Regulations of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University in force from time to time.

### Passing Minimum for Written Examination:

Each candidate who appears for the written examination shall be declared to have passed the written examination only if he/she secures not less than 50% of marks in aggregate in each theory course with a minimum of 45% of marks in the term-end/external examination in each theory course. All other candidates shall be treated as unsuccessful candidate in the written examination. A candidate who fails in one or more theory courses in the written examination shall be permitted to appear again only for those courses in which he/she failed.

### Provisions for Improvement in Theory Courses:

- (i) A candidate who passed in all the courses of a semester shall be permitted to improve the results by reappearing for the whole examination (All Theory Courses) in the next semester only.
- (ii) A candidate shall be permitted to apply for improvement of examinations 30 days in advance of the pertinent semester examination whenever held.

- (iii) If a candidate passes all the courses in reappearance, higher of the two aggregate marks secured by the candidate shall be awarded for that semester. In case the candidate fails in the reappearance for improvement, the marks secured by the candidate in the first appearance will prevail.
- (iv) A candidate who appeared for improvement is eligible for reclassification of class only and will not be considered for ranking purpose.
- (v) Improvement is applicable only for theory examinations and not applicable for practicum components.

# Reappearance for Theory Courses:

Students who have secured 'F' (Fail)/Ab (Absent in the examination) grade in a particular course (other than the practicum components) can reappear during the subsequent end-semester examination. All applicable fees shall be charged for the purpose of re-appearance in (Theory Courses) examinations. Each unsuccessful candidate after the completion of the two academic years/four semesters shall be permitted to reappear for the written examinations within the next three consecutive academic years.

## Revaluation / Retotaling / Xerox Copy of Answer Scripts:

Candidates can apply for revaluation / retotaling / xerox copy of answer scripts to the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University within 20 days after the publication of semester results by paying necessary fee prescribed by the University.

### **Practical Examination:**

Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University will conduct practical examination after the successful completion of 80 working days of School Internship during the third semester. Practical examination shall be normally conducted at the end of third semester. A panel consisting of two external members appointed by the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University will assess the practical works, records, instructional materials, teaching competency, EPC records, and also evidence for successful completion of online course of each candidate as mentioned in Part-A. B. & C.

# Passing Minimum for Practical Examination:

Candidates who have secured not less than 50% in each of the practical component for which the weightage is given shall be deemed to have passed in the practical examination. Others will be treated as unsuccessful candidates in the practical examination.

All the records related to the practical components should be made available to the duly constituted Practical Examination Board at the time of practical examination and the marks awarded by the Practical Examination Board is final.

### Reappearance for Practical Examination:

Each unsuccessful candidate shall be permitted to reappear for the practical examination within the next three consecutive academic years, whenever the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University conducts the practical examination.

### 7. Eligibility for the Award of Degree:

A student shall be declared to be eligible for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) provided that the student has successfully completed the requirements of the B.Ed. programme of study and has passed all the prescribed examinations in all the four semesters within a maximum period of FIVE YEARS reckoned from the commencement of first semester to which the candidate was admitted.

### Classification of Successful Candidates:

The results of successful candidates at the end of all four semesters shall be classified on the basis of aggregate percentage of marks obtained in all the semesters and the aggregate or Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Education.

Class/Distinction shall be awarded to the candidates after they successfully complete the B.Ed. Programme as per the norms specified below:

### **Grading System:**

### **Assigning Grades for Successful Candidates**

Each semester result shall also be declared in terms of grades. A six-point grading system which is based on the actual absolute marks scored and alpha-sign grade as described below shall be adopted for successful/unsuccessful candidates.

The semester Grade Point Average (GPA) shall be computed by dividing the sum of the Grade Point Weights (GPW) of all the courses of the study by the maximum credits for the semester. The GPW are in turn calculated as the product of the grade points earned in the respective courses and the credits assigned to that course. The maximum total marks for each theory course of study is 100, while the credit assigned is 5 (five).

The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of all the semester examinations shall be calculated as the weighted average of the semester grade point average. The CGPA is obtained by dividing the total of semester credit weightages by the maximum credits assigned for the programme.

@ Alpha-Sign Grades A+, A, B, C and D denotes successful completion of the programme. The Grade 'F' denotes failed in the programme and requires for reappearance in the examination. The Grade 'Ab' denotes the student's absent for the examination.

## Ranking Procedure:

Candidates, who passes all the semester examinations in the first attempt are only eligible for ranking provided they secure at least CGPA of 6.0 or Alpha-Sign Grade 'C'.

A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible only for classification of Class/ CGPA and Alpha-Sign Grade, but not for ranking.

### 8. Transitory Regulations:

Whenever a course or scheme of instruction is changed in a particular academic year, examination for three more years shall be conducted immediately following thereafter according to the old regulations/syllabus. Candidates who failed to appear for the examinations or unsuccessful in the examinations shall redo the programme and take the examination in accordance with the Regulations and Syllabus of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, in force from time to time.

# **LIBRARY**

# **General Rules and Regulations**

- 1. Strict silence should be observed inside the library.
- Library functions from Monday to Saturday 09.00 am to 05.30 pm. The library remains closed on Sundays and Government Holidays.
- 3. Time Allotted for Lending Books.

i. B.Ed. : 12.15 pm to 01.30 pm

4. Time Allotted for Returning Books.

i. B.Ed. : 11.15 to 11.30 am & 3.00 to 3.15 pm

- Library users should Sign the Gate Register before entering the library.
- Users are required to deposit their bags / belongings (Other than Valuables like mobiles, Wallets etc.,) at the personal belongings rack.
- 7. Students must wear the ID Card with the rope inside the library all the time.
- 8. Students should produce the ID Card to the library staff when ever asked for.
- Students will be allowed to make use of the reference books (including books, back volumes, dissertations, CD's etc.,) in the library only on submission of the identity card.
- 10. Misuse of library facilities is an offence and calls for punishment as decided by the competent authority.
- 11. Users are required to keep the library neat and tidy.
- 12. Students may approach the librarian and other members of the staff in the library for any help and guidance.

# Borrowing (Books Lending)

- Users should verify the physical condition of the books (for Missing pages, Chapters, Pictures Etc.,) before borrowing.

- Books borrowed must be returned on or before the due date. In case of delay, a late fee of Rs.5/ will be charged per day (including the holidays).
- The loan period may be renewed for a further period of another fortnight. Books will be renewed if there are no reservations.
- Books that are in special demand may be called for at any time when required.
- Books will have to be physically presented for renewals.
- 8. Only one copy / title of a book will be issued to a user.
- 9. All members are hereby informed that they must replace the library resources like Books, CD-ROM, DVD, Question Bank, Periodicals etc, if it is lost or damaged. However in case of internal / external members, if they are not able to replace the above mentioned items (original), they are required to pay three times of the latest price of that resources including processing charges and overdue charges if any. Loss of book must be reported immediately.

- 10. No book in damaged condition will be accepted from the reader, the book will have to be replaced by the borrower. Book Damaged condition indicates: i) Mutilated, ii) Cutting, iii) Tearing, iv) Spoiled and v) Writing in books on any pages by using Pencil or Pen Reference Books, Back Volumes of Journals, Journals, and Magazines are only for reference and will be issued only for overnight during working days.
- 11. When the students finally leave the college, they should return all the library books borrowed by them.
- 12. They should obtain no dues certificate from the librarian before collecting the certificate from the office.

### HOSTEL

Well furnished Hostel is situated inside the college campus and students are provided with hygienic pure vegetarian and nonvegetarian food using the latest steam technology.

- \* The management has installed a mineral water unit for the supply of drinking water to the college and the hostel round the clock.
- ★ The hostel has regular supply of ordinary and hot water with parallel tap system for drinking and bathing.
- \* Smart card attendance system is installed in the hostel to communicate students' arrival and departure to the parents through automatically generated SMS.
- \* On request, special rooms with attached bath room are also provided to the inmates.
- Student with health problems are immediately taken for treatment and one nurse is available for this purpose on the hostel premises always. In addition to that major treatments are supported by Vivekanandha Medical Care Hospital run by the Management.
- \* A separate library with dailies, magazines and journals is functioning in the hostel to improve general knowledge and current affairs.

- \* Special provisions like gymnasium, indoor games, generator, phone facility etc. are available in the hostel.
- Accommodation and food will be provided for student's mother who come to meet the Hostellers and they can stay in the hostel on that night.
- On special occasions the day scholars who have Educational Tour & Industrial Visit Schedule can avail food and accommodation in the Hostel.

### HOSPITAL

To meet emergencies, we have HEALTH CARE CLINIC attached with each hostel and staff are posted with the H.C.C. It is provided with beds for observation, emergency & dressing materials for the first aid. Thus a comprehensive health care is provided for all the students.

### COMMUNICATION CENTER

STD booths with international call facilities are installed in all the hostels for the benefit of the students to communicate with their parents.

### BANKING

Indian Overseas Bank has its branch within the campus. The students and the staff can operate accounts. ATMs facility is available in the college and there are seven ATM inside the campus out of which 4 by IOB, 1 by KVB and 2 by CUB. Furthermore, for the convenience of the students and faculty, City Union Bank ATM is also provided in the campus. Savings bank account has been provided by CUB to all the students and staff members for the convenient payment of fees and salary.

A modern departmental store is also functioning inside the campus for the benefit of students. Besides, a suggestion Box is kept at prominent places for the students to address their concern.

# SUGGESTION BOX

The management has installed suggestion boxes in the college and in the hostel. The students and the staff members may use the box for the representation of their genuine problems / grievances to the management. Also, general suggestions for the improvement of the institution may be put in the box.

## ACADEMIC CODE

- ★ Classes commence at 09.30 am and close at 04.00 pm
- \* Biometric attendance will be taken twice a day at the beginning of FN & AN Session hours.
- \* Students should attend the classes regularly. No student should absent.
- ★ Herself from the class without prior permission from the class teacher and the Head of the Institution.
- ★ Student should have a minimum of 80% attendance for being allowed to University exam.
- \* The leave letter must be counter-signed by parents or by warden in the case of hosteller. In the case of sick leave. medical certificate must be produced.
- ★ Continuous absence of a Student for more than 3 days will be intimated to the parents immediately.
- ★ Monthly tests are conducted for all the B.Ed. classes. Every month.
- ★ Students should make active participation in all functions / seminar classes organized by the College.
- ★ After the completion of the academic cycle, Students shall write Three Model exams.

- No reduction in the mess bill will be given for the Saturdays and Sundays.
- ★ Full mess bill reduction will be given for the days which are falling between the last university Exam and commencement of the next academic year.

#### **GENERAL RULES**

- \* Hostellers should obtain pass for visitors (maximum three persons in number) at the time of admission and without "VISITOR'S PASS" no one will be allowed to contact the inmates.
- ★ Visitors are allowed only on Sundays.
- ★ Only parents and guardians as in the visitor's card will be allowed to contact the inmates.
- \* Inmates will be allowed to go home during the holidays only.
- ★ However, this rule is relaxable in sick-cases.
- ★ Students in ill health should immediately report to the warden for medical treatment.
- ★ The inmates are not allowed to remain in the hostel room during the working hours. However the sick are exempted from this with prior permission from the warden.
- ★ PCO with multi-telephone lines functions at the hostel reception hall for the comfort of all inmates.
- ★ Only the parents are allowed to contact the inmates over phone. Call from others are not entertained.
- ★ Students can make telephone calls during the following hours.

On Week Days - 07.00 a.m. to 10.30 a.m.
On Sundays - 07.00 a.m. to 01.00 p.m.

02.00 p.m. to 05.00 p.m.

- ★ While leaving the room, the inmates should switch off all the lights and fans.
- ★ When the students return to the hostel after holidays, they should reach before 06.00 p.m. outing is not allowed.
- ★ Students' letters will be posted/delivered only after scrutiny.

- ★ The warden reserves the rights to inspect the room and the things of inmates at any time.
- \* Ragging is a punishable offence. If anybody found involved in ragging, she will be immediately expelled from the college and hostel.
- \* Students should not conduct any function or anything like that without the knowledge of the warden. They should not put up anything on the notice board or at any other place.
- ★ Inmates should not keep a large amount of cash, gold or any other costly ornaments in their rooms. The management will not hold any responsibility for the loss of things if any.
- ★ Visitors should bring their identity cards. Otherwise they will not be allowed.
- ★ Visitors are not allowed to enter the rooms of the students.
- \* Students are allowed to talk only with their visitors and not with the visitors of other students. If they do so, that visitor's name will be cancelled from the visitor's card.
- \* For "Send only with Parents" Students: Telephone messages, letters, telegrams etc. from the parents are not accepted to send the students from the hostel. Parents / Guardians who come to take the students with them should produce the visitor's card.
- \* If a student vacates the hostel, she should collect her things within a month.
- ★ After given admission to the hostel, students are not allowed to come as day scholars even for 1 or 2 days.
- \* Parents should avoid sending money through courier services. For any loss, the management will not be responsible.
- \* The possession / use of cell phone is not permitted in the campus, if cell phone is found with any student it will be ceased and will not be returned for any reasons.
- \* All should maintain peace and silence with proper adherence to the codes of conduct framed by the management.
- \* The decision of the management is final on all matters.

#### RAGGING PREVENTION RULES EXTRACT OF ACT NO. 7 OF 1997

An Act to prohibit "Ragging" in Education as in the state of Tamil Nadu. Short title, extent and commencement

- 1. This Act may be called the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act
- 2. It extends to the whole the State of Tamil Nadu.
- 3. It shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of December 1996.

#### **DEFINITION**

In this Act unless the context otherwise requires, 'Ragging' means display of noisy disorderly conduct or doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any. Educational Institution and includes, teasing, abusing of, playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such students or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course willingly do.

#### **PROHIBITION OF RAGGING**

Ragging within or outside the educational institution is prohibited.

#### PENALTY FOR RAGGING

Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates. 'ragging' within or outside any Educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

#### **DISMISSAL OF STUDENT**

Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational Institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other Educational Institution.

## SUSPENSION OF STUDENT

- 1. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complaints of ragging to the Head of an Educational institutions, or to any other person responsible for the management of the Educational Institution, Such head of the Educational Institution or person responsible for the management of the Educational Institution shall enquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the Educational institution.
- The decision of the Head of the Educational Institution or the person responsible for the management of the Educational Institution on any student. Indulged in ragging under subsection (1) shall be final.
